We would also like to highlight that the best scored abstracts have been allocated into the award sessions, one for trainees and one for senior presentation. There will be prizes awarded by Hip International, and the Bone and Joint Journal on that basis.

We would like to thank both the Italian and British Hip Societies for their support and help in coordinating this congress. We would like to thank OIC for making it possible. We would like to thank our reviewers for their help in putting the programme together and our faculty for the outstanding content, and above all we would like to thank you for joining us at this meeting and for your commitment to hip surgery.
